Public Liability insurance provides peace of mind that these risks are financially protected, allowing contractors to focus on delivering safe and compliant work. Even when strong controls are in place, accidents can happen, and the policy is there to also provide legal defence costs, to protect the business. Legal defence costs pay for legal costs to defend a claim made by a third party, even if the Insured is not negligent, they need to defend against that third party claim.

Clients increasingly expect contractors to hold adequate insurance as a sign of professionalism and reliability.
